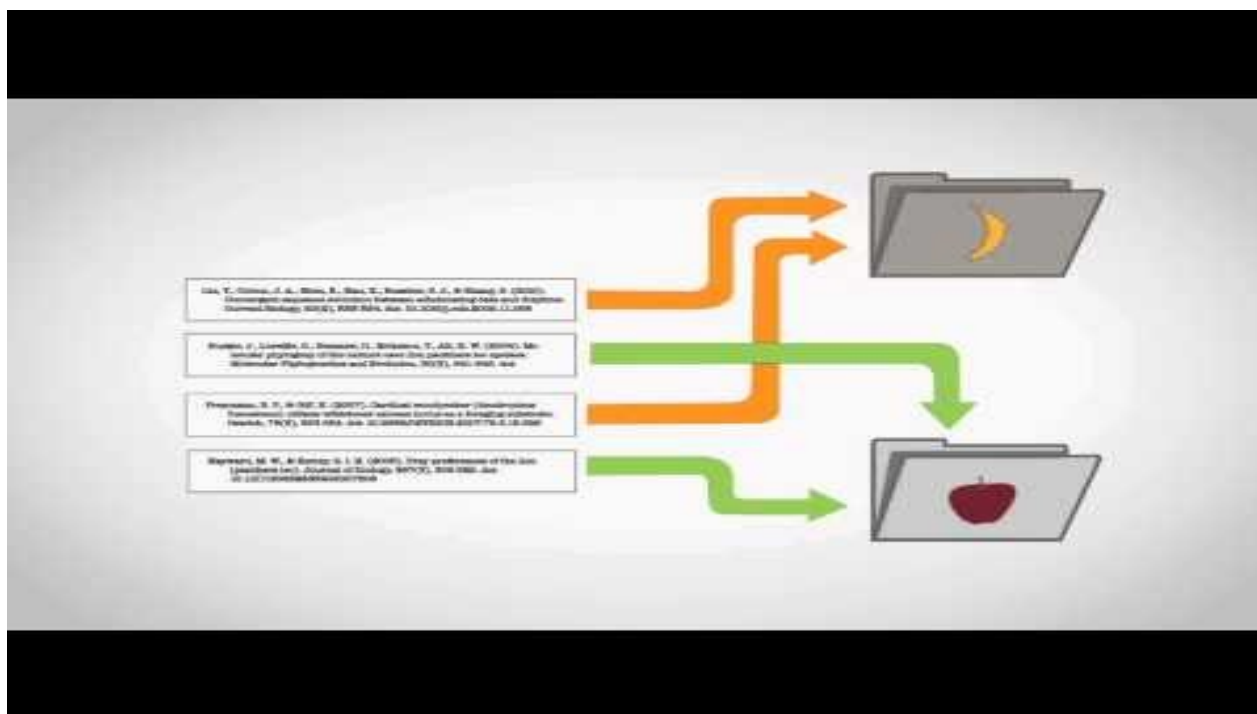

- Collect references & PDFs in one place
 - Categorise & organise
 - Output references in correct styles for publication

Why use a Reference Manager?

- ➔ Format citations and references correctly
- ➔ Collect, store and organise
- ➔ Annotate and manage PDFs
- ➔ Create bibliographies
- ➔ Build a researcher profile

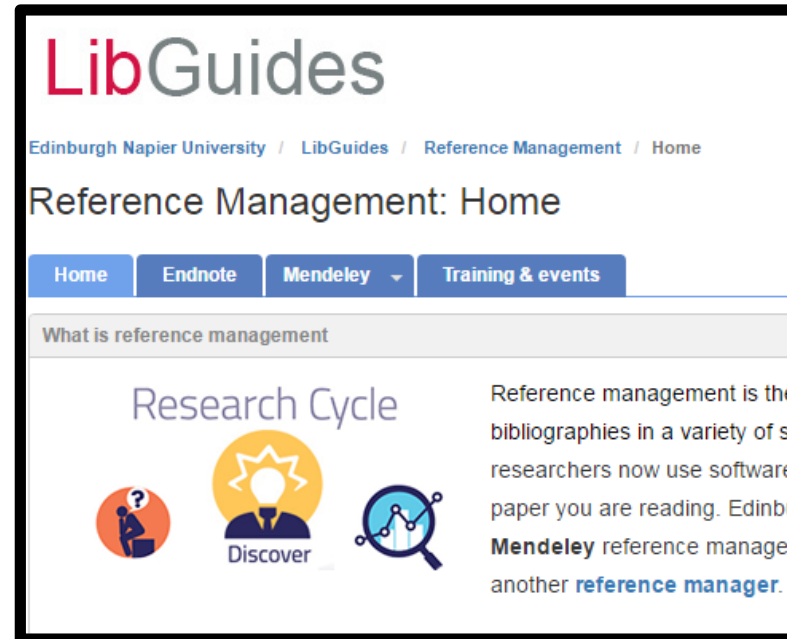
Training and events calendar
