

Grading in WebPA

After allocating group marks you create a mark sheet so that each's student's group mark is mediated by their peer rating (you can create more than one mark sheet)

Here you decide the % of the group mark that's peer assessed. For example group **Tut1-Fand** is given 70%.....

- a) PA Weighting of 0% would mean each student receives a score of 70%.
- b) PA Weighting of 50% would mean each students receives a score of 35% plus the other 35% mediated by the peer rating.
- c) PA Weighting of 100% would mean each student's 70% is entirely mediated by their peer rating.

Algorithm Parameters

Enter the parameters to use below. When you've made your changes, click the *create mark sheet* button.

What percentage of the group's total mark should be peer-assessed?

PA Weighting

Next decide of any penalty for students who do not provide a peer rating. There will be groups where at least once student did not complete the form, and WebPA compensates for this by applying a multiplication factor to each student mark in the group (see FAQ). So you don't have to apply a penalty, and any you do will affect all non-completers regardless of whether they had a valid reason for not doing so.

If a student has not submitted any marks for the assessment, how much should they be penalised?
