



## Plagiarism Checking of Submissions to Moodle Assignments

Moodle Assignments have been limited by the inability to provide plagiarism checking, and Turnitin Assignments are limited by the inability to support group submissions. Moodle Assignments now include a Turnitin plagiarism plugin so an originality report can be generated for any paper submitted by a student individually or on behalf of a group.




Tutors can use the feedback tools in the Moodle
Assignment or in Turnitin Feedback Studio, and any grade
entered in one will update the other, ie. grades are
synchronised. However it is recommended that grading
and feedback takes place within the Moodle Assignment as
only it has a grade item in Moodle Grades.



## **Group submissions**


The Moodle Assignment has settings designed for group submissions whereby a student can submit a document on behalf of the group, and the tutor's marks and feedback are distributed to all members of the group simultaneously.





While all students will be able to see the % similarity score, the actual originality report is only available to the student who submitted the paper (and to the tutor).

Therefore all feedback comments must be made using the Moodle Assignment tools as any comments in Turnitin Feedback Studio would only be available to the student who submitted the paper.



## **Enabling Turnitin plagiarism checking in a Moodle Assignment**

There is a section in the Moodle Assignment settings to configure the Turnitin plugin, and these will apply regardless of whether the assignment is for an individual or a group submission. The plugin does allow for a Feedback Studio rubric to be attached to the assignment but this is not recommended. All feedback should be made using the Moodle Assignment tools which include rubrics and grading forms, and these are selected from the *Grading method* setting within the *Grade* section.
