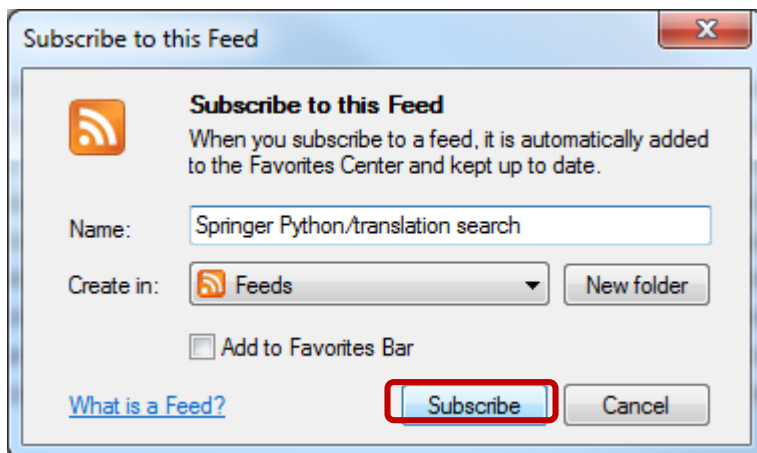
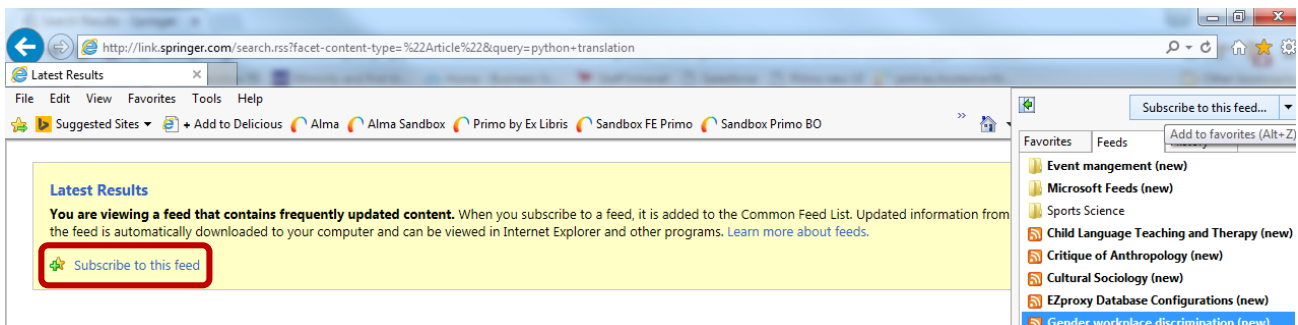
## Operating system specific browsers

### Windows

#### Internet Explorer 11

IE 11 has an inbuilt RSS reader.

1. Click on the RSS icon  on a website.
2. **Subscribe to feed.** Then **subscribe** again.



3. The feed appears in the list above.

#### Microsoft Edge

Edge does not have an inbuilt RSS feed reader, nor does it accommodate add ons. Use Chrome or Firefox.

# Apple OS

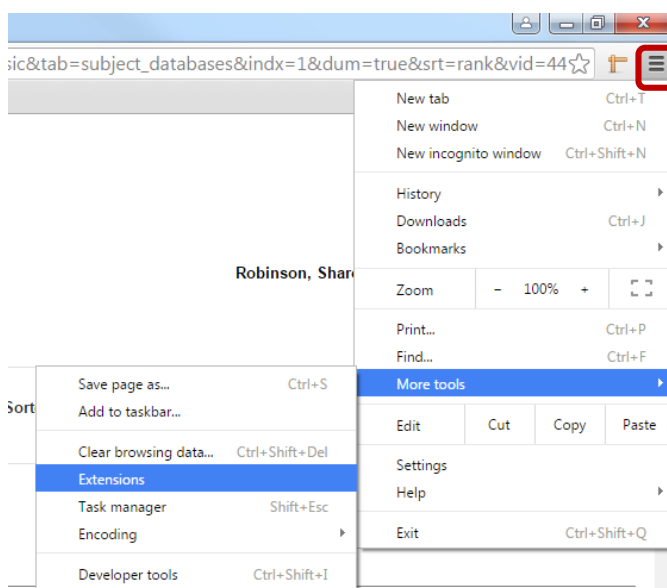
Only the latest versions of Safari for OS X El Capitan or OS X Yosemite have an inbuilt RSS feeder. Use Chrome or Firefox or see [suggestions](#).

## Generic browsers

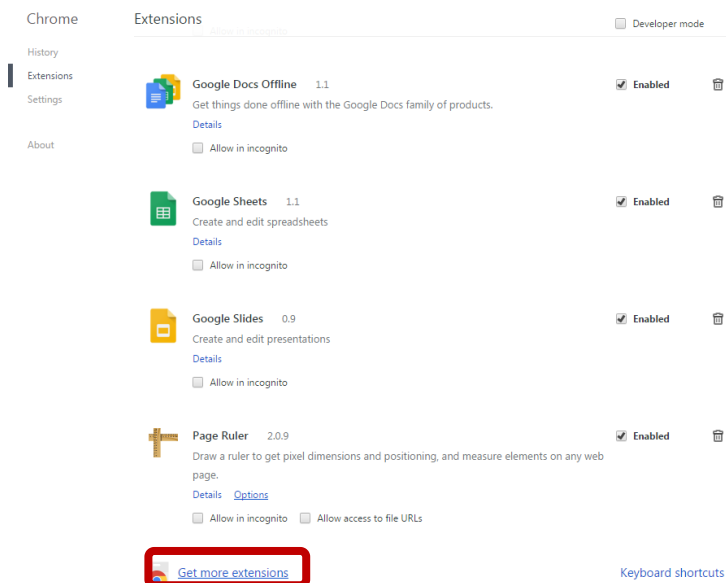
### Chrome

As Chrome does not have inbuilt RSS reader, an extension needs to be added.

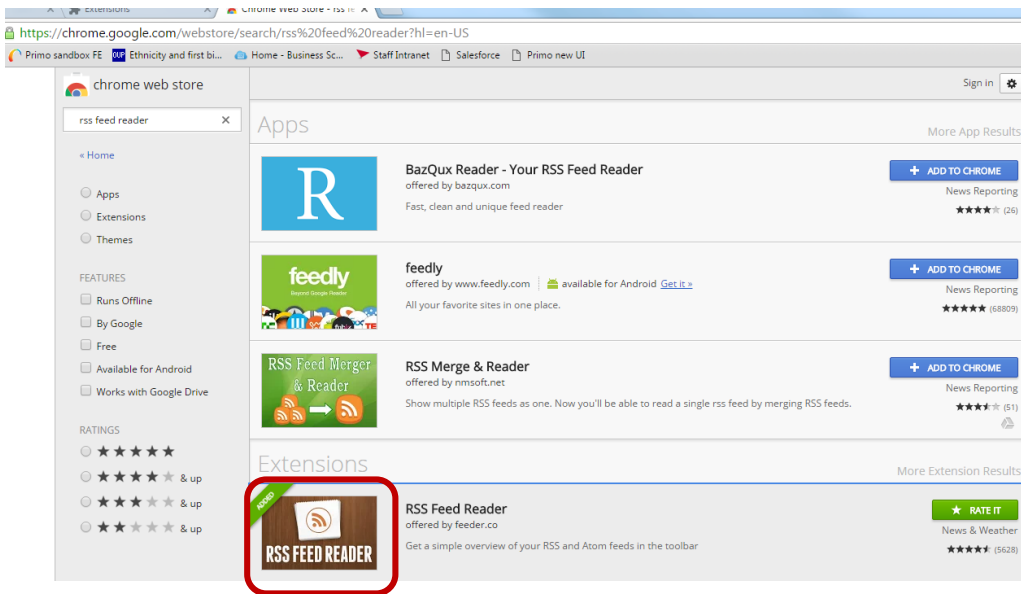
1. Click on 3 line icon > More tools > Extensions



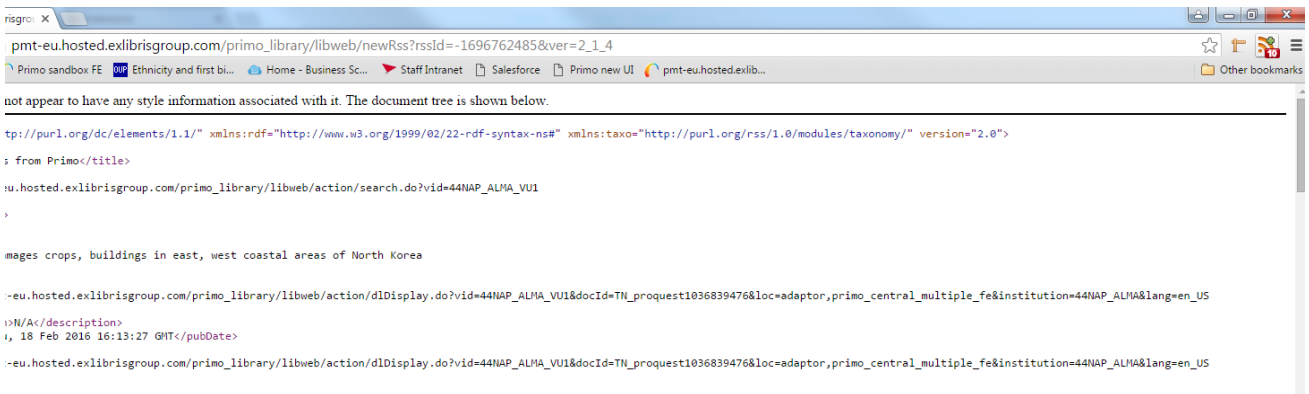
2. Get more extensions.



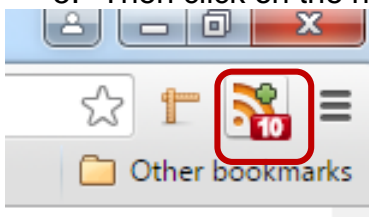
3. Then search **RSS feed reader**. Make selection and **Add to Chrome**.



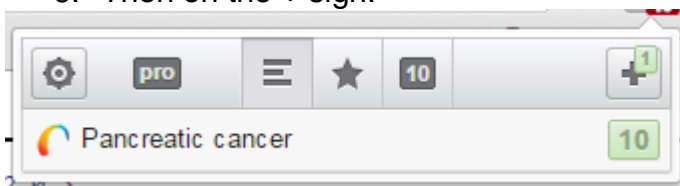
4. Click on an RSS icon on a journal website or for a search. You will see something like this:



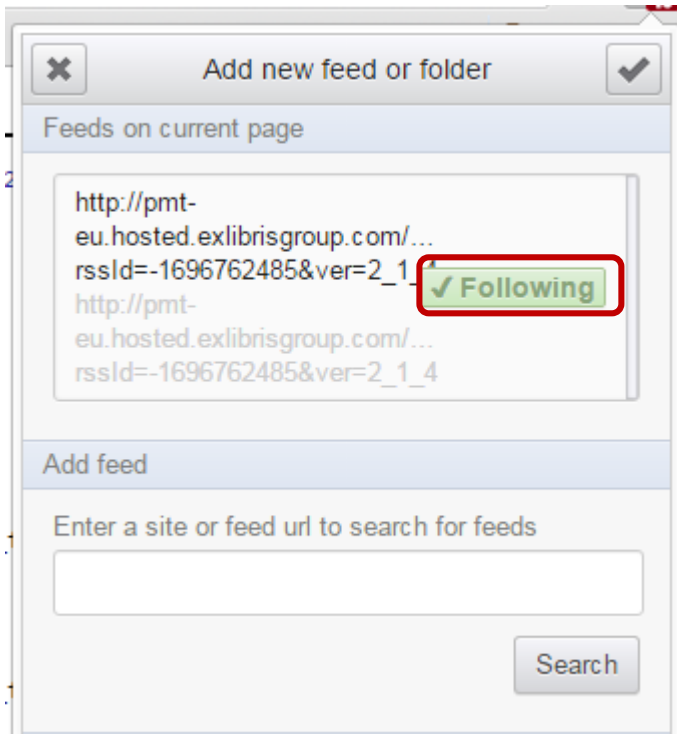
5. Then click on the new RSS icon in the Chrome toolbar.



6. Then on the + sign.



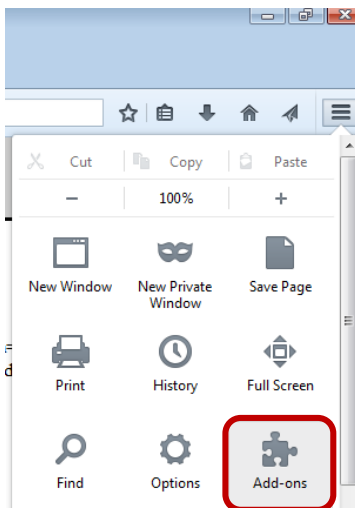
7. In this case, the URL is provided, so click **Follow**. If a URL/link is provided, you should add this to the **Add feed** box.



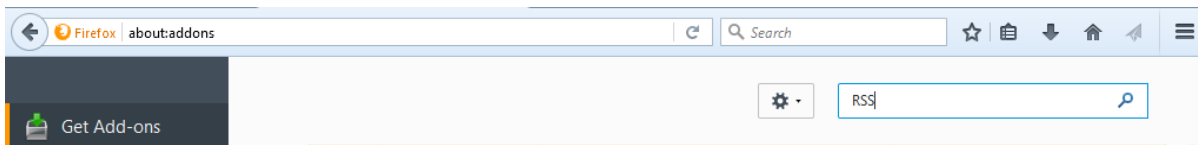
## Firefox

Firefox does not have an inbuilt RSS reader so you will need to add one.

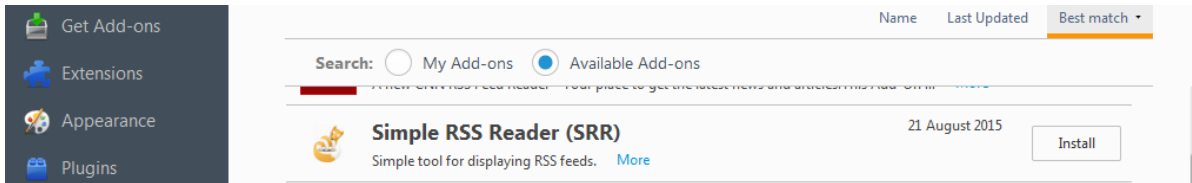
1. Click on icon and select **Add-ons**.



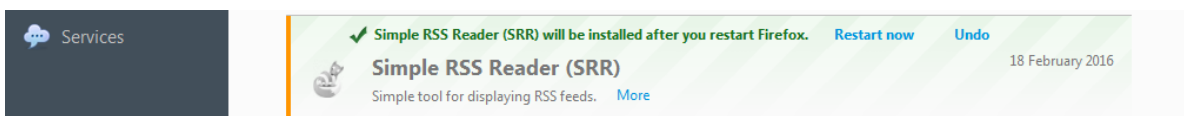
## 2. Search RSS.



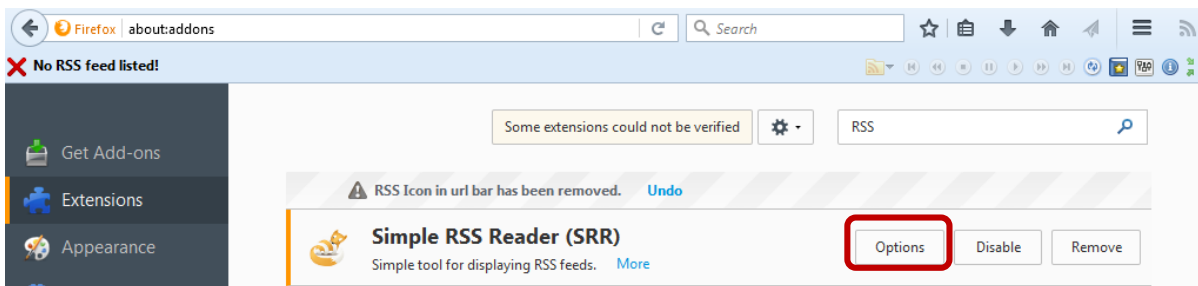
## 3. For example, Select Simple RSS Reader (SRR) and install.



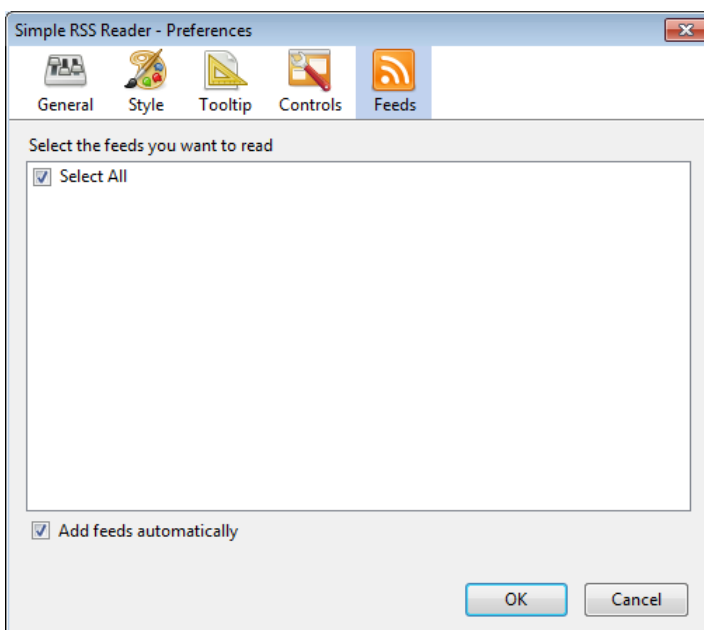
## 4. Restart Firefox.



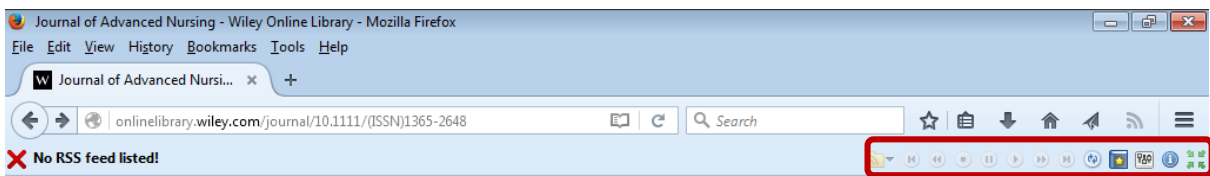
## 5. Click Options.



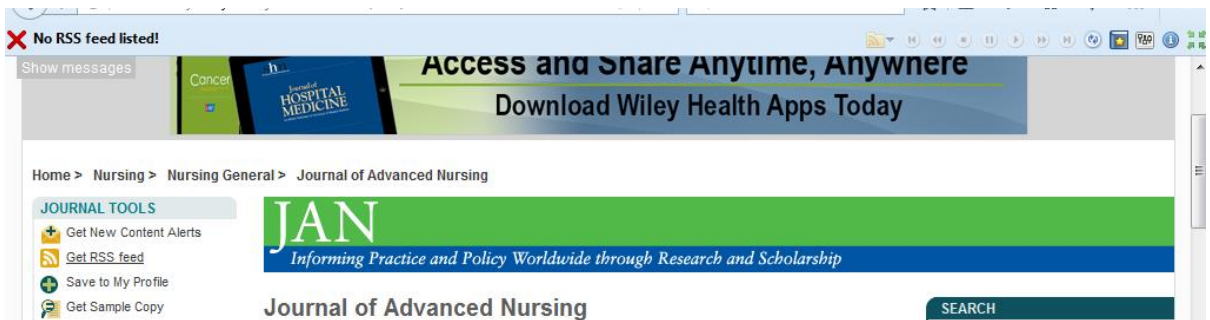
## 6. Your RSS feeds will be listed.



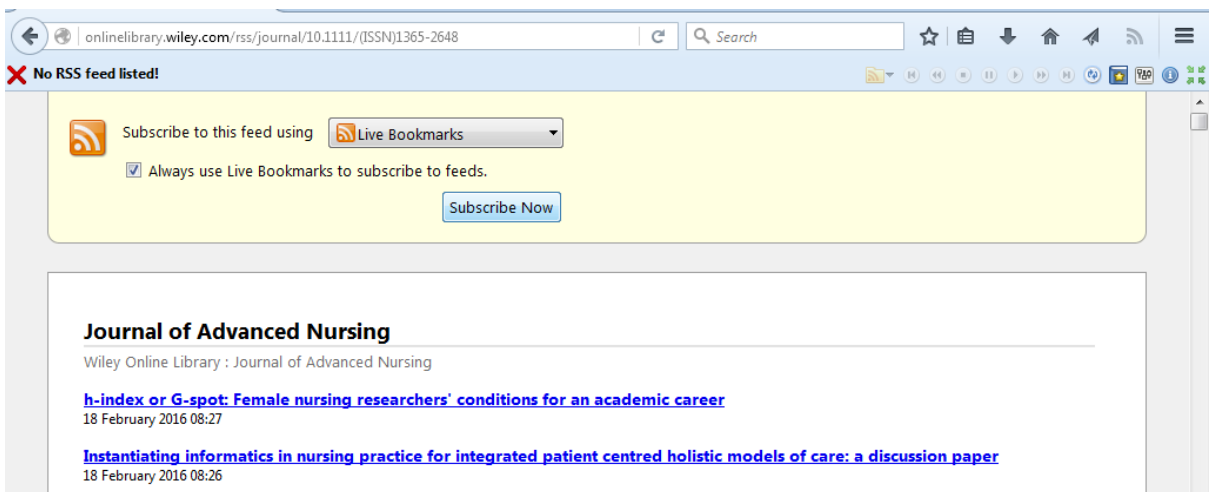
7. You will now see a new series of icons on your browser toolbar.



8. Example RSS feed set up. Journal of Advanced Nursing. Click Get RSS feed.



9. Click on **Subscribe Now**



10. You will now be able to see the RSS feed in the tool bar. The display can be paused.
