HOW DO YOU START?

Starting your lit review

- Define your topic of study
 - consider sub-topics to explore
- Find research and read critically
 - Consider key findings
 - Does the evidence confirm your view or provide a counter-argument?
 - Take notes! References, page numbers etc
- Organise thematically
 - Themes based on your readings
 - Can provide headings within your review

Starting your lit review (cont.)

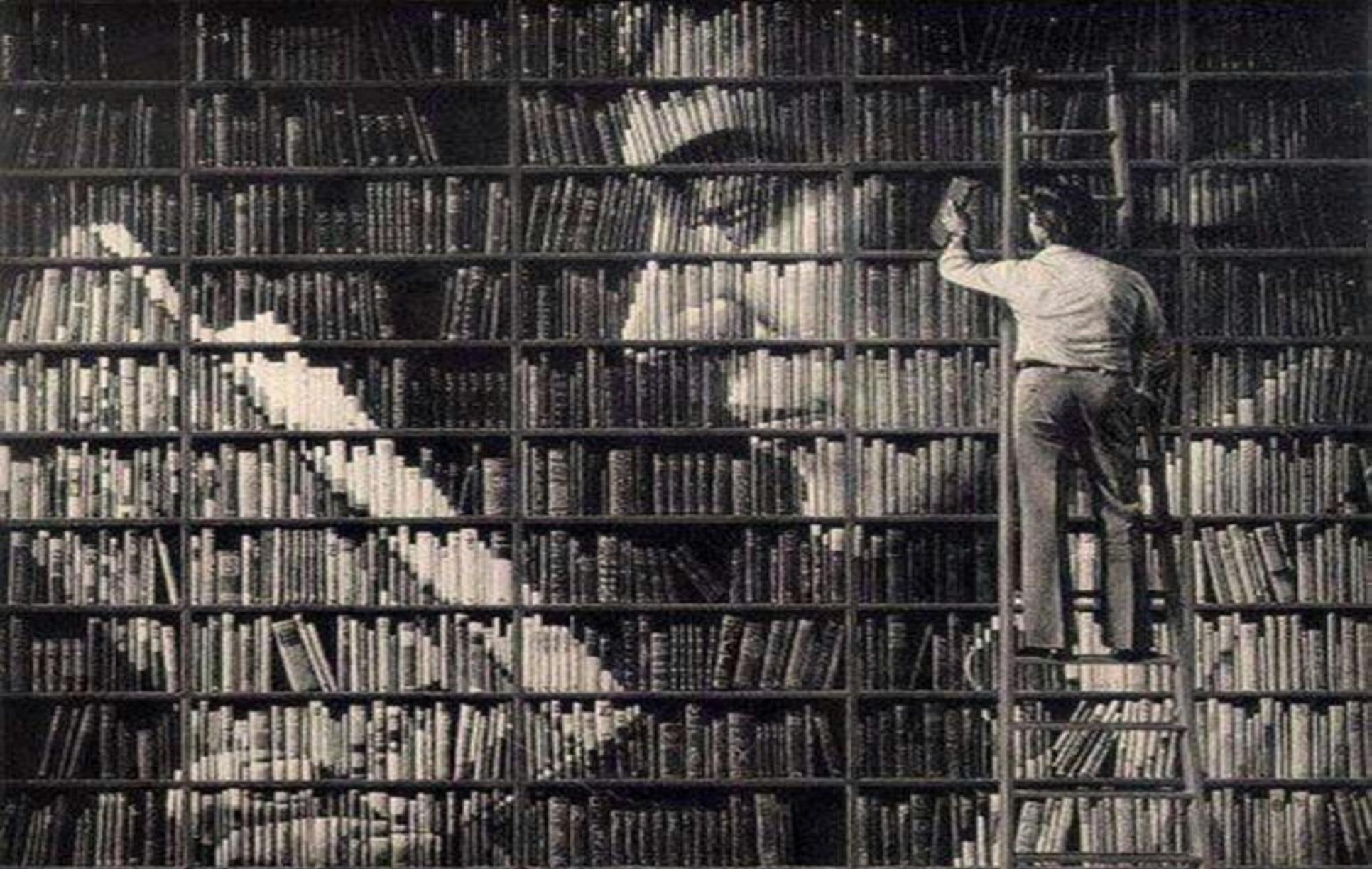
- Define what you're looking for
- Identify key concepts & terms, including broader, narrower and related terms (use a dictionary, thesaurus etc)
- Write out your keywords and concepts
- Set limits
 - geographic (UK, EU, US, Worldwide...)
 - date range (before/after 20??)
 - Type of publication

What might you include?

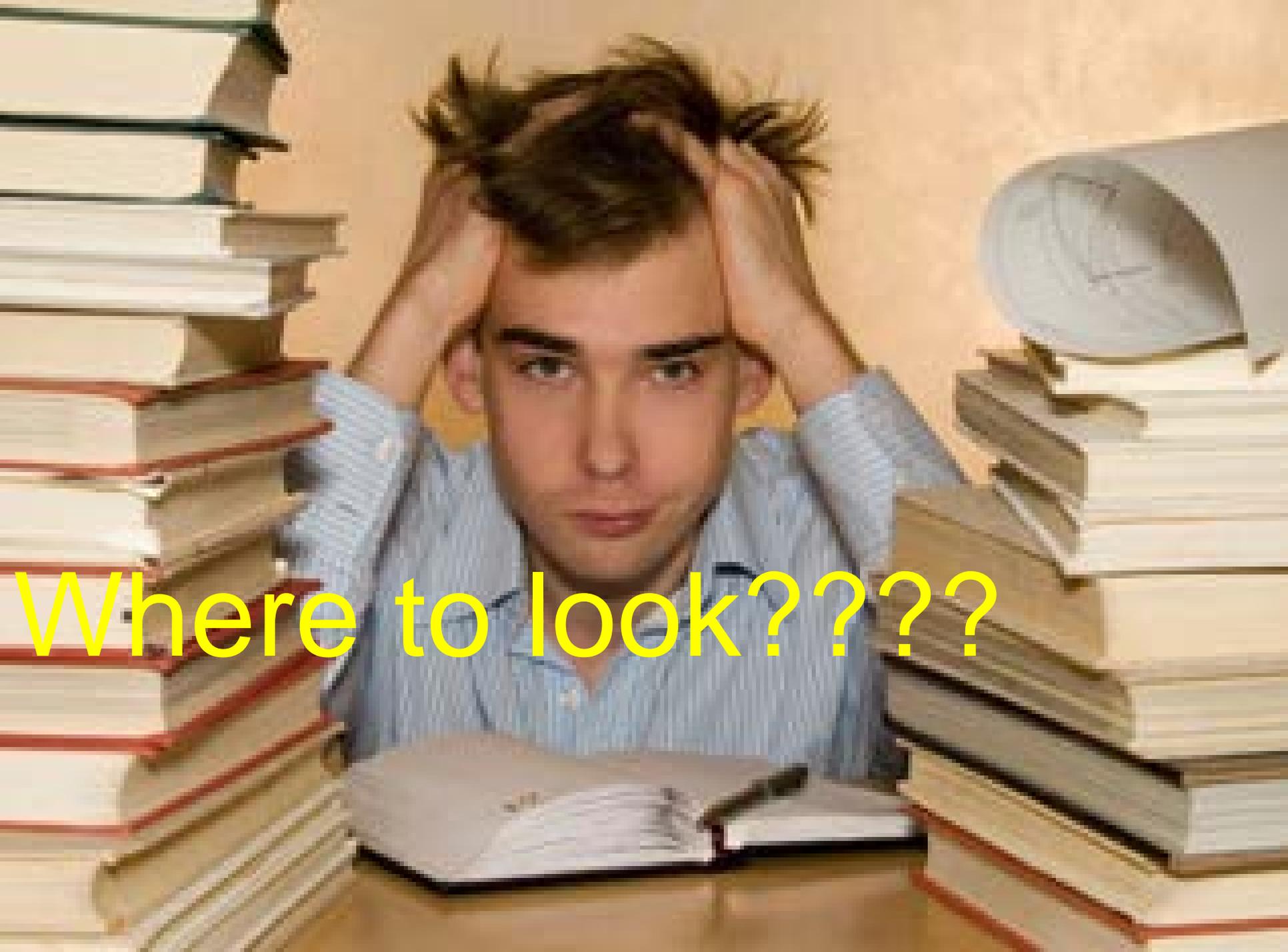
- Academic journal articles
- Working papers
- Conference papers
- theses

But perhaps also

- Financial data?
- Company information?
- Market information?

Research Databases

- **Web of Knowledge:** produced by the Institute for Scientific Information (ISI) and provides access to the following indexes:
- Web of Science:
 - Science Citation Index
 - Social Sciences Citation Index
 - Arts and Humanities Citation Index
- ISI Proceedings 1990-
 - Science and Technology

The Citation indexes contain complete coverage of journal content dating back to 1981 and each week up to 22,000 new references and 365,000 new cited references are added.

- **Index to Theses**
 - Database detailing Theses published throughout the UK & Ireland. Some full text. Available via ABI Inform
- **ETHOS:** British Library thesis service. Some full text.

Electronic sources - search tips

- Set limits
 - geographic (UK, EU, US, Worldwide...)
 - date range (before/after 20??)
 - scope (overview, case study)
- Free text searches the whole record
- Field search title/abstract/author
- Phrases use quotation marks e.g. "lean production"
- Boolean
 - and* = both terms
 - or* = either 1st or 2nd term
 - not* = find 1st but not 2nd term
- Truncation econom*
- Wildcard
 - may be a \$? or another symbol
 - e.g. organi?ation

- Able to guide you to holdings elsewhere
 - Other academic libraries with SCONUL Access
 - National Library of Scotland
 - Inter Library Loans from the British Library

Remember and leave time though!

What to read/evaluate first...

- Any recent review papers?
 - Outline literature in area
- What have the good quality journals published recently?
 - Chartered Association of Business Schools journal guide
- Citations
 - How many does the paper have?
 - If new, is there an Altmetric score?

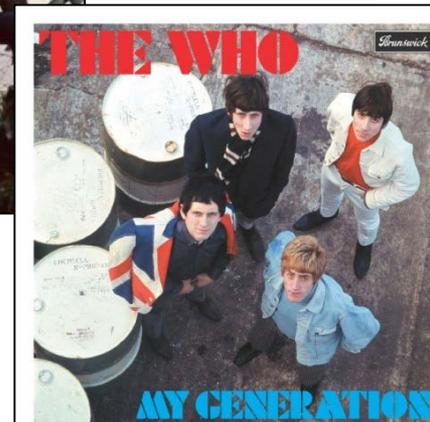
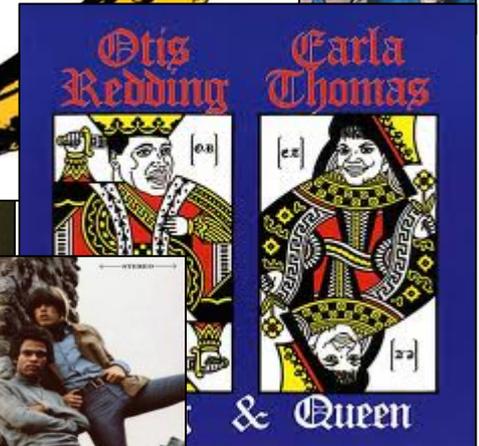
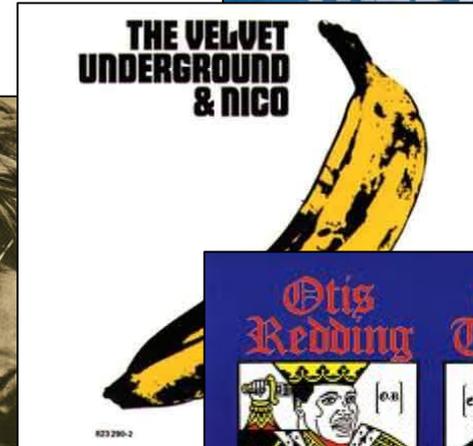
Staying up to date

- Register with individual databases
- Save searches
- Set up alerts
 - Daily
 - Weekly
 - Fortnightly
 - Monthly

Notification of new papers using your search terms will be sent to you via email.

Keeping Records

- note titles consulted
- note keywords used
- note full details of any useful references
- note locations of items found



Reference List

Any sources that you quote or cite need to go in your
Reference List

Purpose:

- To acknowledge the sources consulted
- To enable other readers to access the material themselves
- To provide an overview of the literature relating to the topic

We use the APA 6th Referencing System



Reference Management

- Endnote is available on all Napier PC's via network applications.
 - Available off campus through VDS.
 - Mendeley another option
 - Free to download

- Both integrate with MS Word so you can import citations into your text as you are writing (cite while you write)

Writing up!

- Literature review needs structure
 - Introduction
 - Broad context of research
 - Main topics of investigation
 - How review is structured
 - Main body
 - analysis of literature theme by theme
 - Show how your research builds on previous work
 - Conclusion
 - Summarise state of research in your field
 - Identify gaps in knowledge
 - Show how your research is going to address gaps
