



Open access (OA) is about making your research publications freely available for everyone to read and reuse without needing to pay. It's a great way to increase the readership (and citations!) of your research.

The two routes to open access are repositories ('Green' open access) and open access publishing ('gold' open access').

Repositories:

- Worktribe is Edinburgh Napier's repository platform
- Researchers can deposit any output type (journal article, book chapter, dataset, etc.)
- Sometimes there are restrictions on which version of an article can be deposited. The library will check this for you.

Open access publishing:

- The published version is immediately open access on the publisher website
- Creative Commons licenses are applied
- Openly available for everyone, forever
- Some journals charge a fee – but the university has open access agreements with some publishers to cover the cost. We never expect you to pay to make your research open access.
